

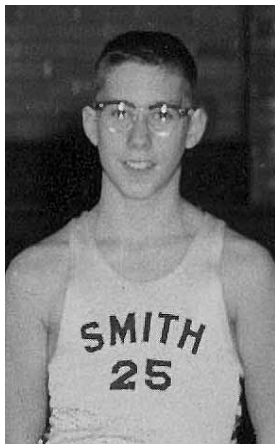
# York City Dollars for SCHOLARS

## REMEMBERING TOM FOUST

October 19, 1946 – June 30, 2010

On June 30, 2010, the students of York City School District lost one of their greatest cheerleaders. That day, Tom Foust, York City Dollars for Scholars founding board member and a member of the York City School Board, lost a valiant fight against cancer.

Tom fought the disease with the same passion he poured into all aspects of his rich public life: his career in affordable housing, his dedication to the students of York City schools through his role on the York City School board, and for his love of athletics.

Born in York in 1946, Tom grew up in the Salem Square neighborhood of York City. A product of the York City Schools, Tom attended Lincoln Elementary School, Smith Junior High School and graduated from William Penn Senior High School in 1964. Not surprisingly, Tom won the American

Legion Award for student leadership in Junior High School. He began his lifelong love of athletics as a midget football player and grew to be a star on the York High Bearcat's football team. Continuing his education at Johns Hopkins University on a full scholarship, Tom returned to York after graduation and married his high school sweetheart. Sharon and Tom have lived in York City throughout their married life, where they raised their son, Ian, who is also a graduate of William Penn.



Tom's dedication to public schools has been close to legendary. In his nearly 11 years of service to the York City School Board, Tom served for several years as Vice President of the Board and was influential on many committees: Finance, Buildings and Grounds, Athletics, Personnel Negotiations, Strategic Planning and the Charter School Ad Hoc Committee. He represented the District on the Lincoln Intermediate Unit Board and the York County School of Technology Board.

And Tom's legacy will live on through others. In April 2010, Tom was surprised by scores of friends and community leaders from across the region at a Tom Foust Tribute. Donations made then as honorariums, and later as memorials by many friends and family, will provide several scholarships for deserving York City graduates. And we are honored to announce the formation of the Tom Foust Scholarship Fund, which has been created from the generous bequest of our late friend and colleague. With this memorial gift, Tom will continue to help the students of York City School District far into the future.

We raise our glasses to toast our friend Tom Foust, community leader and activist, a man passionate about opportunities for the children of York City. ■

## PENNY BRIGADE

Over the years, the Penny Brigade has grown from a small fundraiser, yielding only enough money to fund a few scholarships, to a District-wide initiative with the support of students, parents and staff. As the Penny Brigade has grown, YCDFS has looked for ways to build excitement for the cause and reward students for their participation.

In 2010, the Penny Brigade Calendar of Events included Grab Bag Day for the elementary schools and a District-wide Dress "Spirited" Day. Goode Elementary showed their spirit by raising \$775.06 in one day!

By far the greatest success of the Penny Brigade this year was Adopt-a-Scholar Week in which the elementary schools competed to raise the most money and help their York City Scholar win a prize. The Scholars, who are students of William Penn Senior High School and attended elementary schools in the District, were eager to participate in this event to build support for YCDFS.

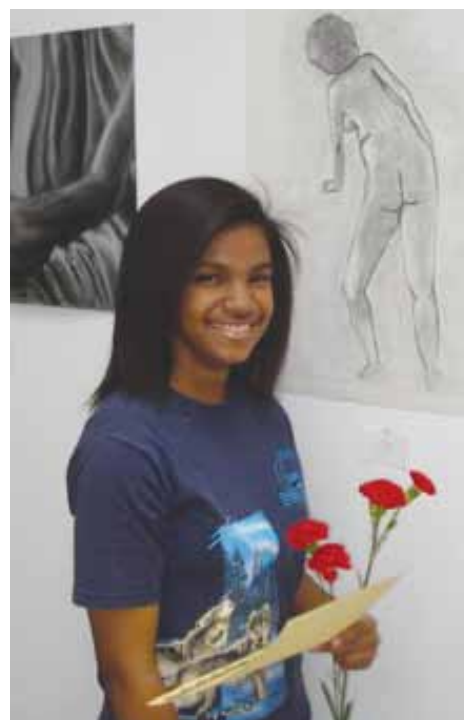
In the end, Lincoln-Edison Charter School was able to raise the most money – \$945.15 in one week. Lincoln-Edison's adopted scholar, Aaliyah Dorsey, won a \$25 gift card for Staples.

In Penny Brigade's 12-year history, seven schools exceeded their previous records by raising more money than they had before, making this year the most successful in Penny Brigade's 5-year history.

We raised a grand total of \$15,448.84 for YCDFS scholarships!

As we look forward to next year's Penny Brigade, we are awed by the energy and enthusiasm with which the students and staff pursue fundraising to benefit college-bound students from York City.

Thank you to everyone who has contributed, in even a small way, to the continued success of the Penny Brigade over the years. With your help, 2011 is sure to be another great year!

## Mindy Radzik, 2006 YCDFs Scholar Graduates from Kutztown University

We are happy to announce that the first class of York City Scholars (5 students), including Mindy Radzik, graduated from college in May 2010.



Mindy grew up in a compassionate family who adopted 8 special needs children. Growing up loving and caring for her siblings and inspired by her grandparents who were visually impaired, Mindy knew early on that she wanted to devote her life to the education of special needs children. Mindy hosted the National Church Conference of the Blind as her senior graduate project and was motivated by observing professionals helping her brothers and sisters.

Mindy was accepted into the York City Scholars program and found the relationships with both the group of program participants and the program counselor very supportive.

Her family was grateful for the assistance they received during the college application process. Mindy's mother wants to thank our program for this opportunity. "I didn't go to college and didn't know how to help my daughter apply to colleges. I really wanted Mindy to go further than I did. Now I have helped other people in my family work through this process."

Mindy enrolled at Kutztown University and finished her B.A. in four years with a dual certification as a teacher for the Visually Impaired and Early Childhood / Elementary Education.

On August 13, she started her job as a teacher for the Visually Impaired at the Lincoln Intermediate Unit#12.

Mindy has worked hard to make her goals a reality. Her advice to current students is to think positively. "Don't put the emphasis on what you can't do, but on what you can do."
